### Design brief for artworks

The Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian is seeking artwork by Queensland children and young people for publication on its website.

Artwork accepted for publication will be posted on the Commission's website in the Kids' Zone. You can check out the Zone by going to [www.ccypcg.qld.gov.au](http://www.ccypcg.qld.gov.au) and clicking on the Kids' Zone tab. The Commission has a Bulletin Board where there is a range of work produced by children and young people showcased.

The Commission is seeking artworks that illustrate articles from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child

### Purpose

If accepted, your artwork will be published on the Commission's website. This means your artwork must be sent electronically. When choosing what medium (eg. paint, pencil, pen) to use for your artwork, choose one which will allow your work to be easily scanned.

1. Study the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child either by yourself or with your class.
2. Go to <http://eab.ed.gut.edu.au/activities/projects/childart/>
3. Check out artworks by other children about children's rights.
4. Choose a medium to work in and create an artwork illustrating an article from the UN Convention.
5. When your artwork is finished, ask your teacher for help scanning it.

6. Name the file you have created [NAME\\_Article XX\\_ART](#)  
Instead of NAME, write your first name.  
Instead of XX, write the number of the Convention Article your work illustrates.
7. Write a caption for your work. The caption should explain the Article illustrated in your artwork and why you chose to represent it.
8. Type your caption into a WORD file and name the file [NAME\\_CAPTION](#)
9. Your caption should be no more than 50 words. Type it in Ariel 18 point.

When you have created two electronic files, one for your artwork and another for your caption, you are almost ready to send your work. There is just one more important thing to do....

- Download a release form from the CCYPCG website.
- Ask your parent or guardian to complete and sign the release form.  
(The Commission can not publish your artwork unless it has a release form with it).
